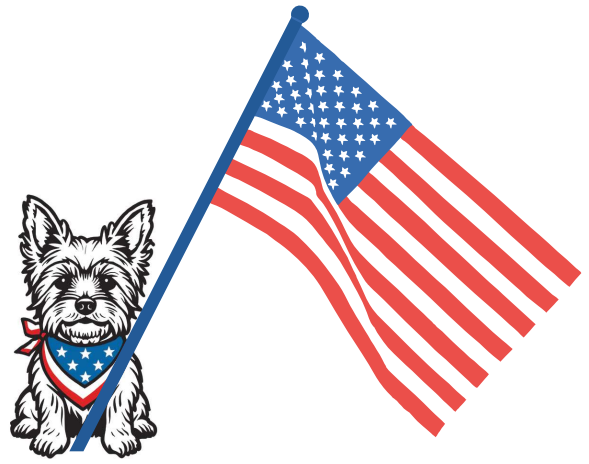

The American Flag



Red, white, and blue—the colors symbolize specific virtues:

- Red represents hardiness, valor, and bloodshed in defense of freedom.
- White signifies purity, innocence, and high moral standards.
- Blue stands for vigilance, perseverance, and justice.

These colors originated from the Great Seal of the United States in 1782.

Flag Design:

- The 13 alternating red and white stripes represent the original 13 colonies, while the white stars on a blue field represent the current 50 states.

Patriotic Symbolism:

- The colors are commonly used together in American patriotic celebrations, such as Independence Day, to evoke a sense of unity and pride.

Historical Context:

- The colors were not assigned specific meanings when the flag was first adopted in 1777, but rather when the Great Seal was designed a few years later.
